



Capacity Building for WUAs within the Olifants/Doring Catchment

The project training framework has been developed to build the capacity of water users, particularly members of the established Water Users Associations (WUAs) within the Olifants/Doring and Sandveld Catchments. The training framework focuses on the management and protection of water resources throughout the Olifants/Doring and Sandveld Catchments. Funding has been made available to pilot the training framework in the Olifants-Doring and Sandveld Catchment in the Western and Northern Cape. After careful monitoring and evaluation the training will then be taken to catchments in the other Water Management Areas throughout South Africa.

Strand 5: Institutional processes for protecting our water resources (Catchment Management Agencies, Water User Associations,


The focus will be on developing the understandings and skills needed by the WUAs to identify and address issues affecting their particular water resources.






Training Materials


