

OLIFANTS RIVER WETLAND AWARENESS Ebenhaeser

"The Ebenhaeser Wetland is found on the southern bank of the Olifants River, approximately 15 kilometres upstream of the river estuary and the Atlantic Ocean. River water quantity and quality play an important role in the

survival of the wetland, and the livelihoods of the subsistence fishermen.

"Over time, the river and wetland has slowly degraded, probably due to the changes in land use and the increased use of agrochemicals such as fertilizers, herbicides and pesticides. To make matters worse, poor Ebenhaeser Multi-Purpose Resource Centre (MPRC).

Ebenhaeser is a community with about 150 emerging farmers, who each own a piece of land where they plant their crops. Most of the farmers also have a few head of cattle and the cattle need pasture. The farmers burn the reeds in the wetlands,

forcing new growth which is good for grazing. "The farmers do not realise the damage that are doing. The reeds are slowly starting to encroach into agricultural land. The burning of the reeds is also killing and displacing many birds," explains Mannel.

According to Mannel, "The broader community and specifically the small-scale farmers need to be made aware of how vulnerable and delicate the eco-system bordering their farms is."

The Ebenhaeser MPRC has initiated an Olifants River Wetlands Awareness programme. It aims to provide information and create awareness that will ensure the sustainable utilisation of the wetland not only by the cattle farmers, but also by the subsistence fishermen and local ecotourism initiatives.

The long term goals of the project are to:

- Protect and preserve the wetland and other natural areas around Ebenhaeser.
- Develop a set of environmental awareness materials focussing on the wetland, river and estuary.
- Establish an environmental club.
- Develop a hiking trail.
- Create employment and
